The first photograph appeared on the front cover of the magazine *Ambiance* (second photograph) on the 17th January 1945, two days before Brasillach's trial. The photograph, taken at Belinitchi, shows Brasillach and Jeantet as journalists accompanying Doriot on his visit to the L.V.F. (Légion des Volontaires Français) who were fighting alongside the Germans against the Soviet forces. The legend of Brasillach wearing German uniform is supposed to originate from an 'error' in interpreting this photograph.
