This *Blackwell Guide* provides a broad-ranging introduction to ancient Greek drama, which flourished principally in Athens from the sixth to the third century BC. All three genres of Greek drama are discussed – tragedy, comedy, and satyr play – as well as the five surviving playwrights – Aeschylus, Sophokles, Euripides, Aristophanes, and Menander, together with brief entries on lost playwrights.

The *Guid*e also addresses contextual issues, such as: the origins of the dramatic art forms; the conventions of the festivals, the theater, and the performers; the relationship between drama and the worship of Dionysos; the political dimension; and how to read and watch *Greek drama*. The final section consists of 46 one-page synopses of each of the surviving plays.
