Teaching the Pronunciation of English as a Lingua Franca

This user-friendly handbook and CD pack gives readers an accessible description of English as a Lingua Franca (ELF) and applies the emergent findings of recent research to classroom practice. The handbook explores the benefits of an ELF approach to pronunciation and explains how to plan, teach, and assess it. It also demonstrates how the learner's first language can be a useful resource in the ELF classroom.

The CD features dialogues between ELF speakers from fifteen different first language backgrounds talking about their work, studies, and cultures, as well as their attitudes to ELF pronunciation. The recordings can be used for the analysis of variation in different aspects of ELF pronunciation, and for listening practice in accent variation and to stimulate debate on the issues behind an ELF approach to pronunciation.

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
