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No trend in migration volume; Migration nearly universal; Much repeated migration after a short interval; Migration rate affected by size of areal units; Return migration very frequent; In-migration more variable than out-migration; Age a major factor; Depressed areas attract few in-migrants; Regions can be defined by gross migration flows; Effect of household tenure not readily assessable; People not living in private households highly migratory; People not living in families also highly migratory; High incomes and low status associated with high mobility; Distance moved depends upon motives for migration; Moves on marriage very frequent; Sexes move nearly equally; Dependent children little deterrent to migration; Complex reaction of migration streams to economic change; Most rapid growth is suburban.

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
